Reading

Attainment (all key stages) Guidance

- A sentence for key stage 1 reading attainment of the expected standard has not been triggered because the criteria have not been met or the cohort is lower than 11 pupils. Key stage 1 attainment of greater depth in reading (39%) was significantly **above** national and in the **highest** 20% of all schools in 2019.
- A sentence for phonics has not been triggered because the criteria have not been met or the cohort is lower than 11 pupils.
- Early years foundation stage attainment of the expected standard in the reading early learning goal was not significantly different to national or not in the highest/lowest 20% of all schools in 2018.

Writing

Attainment (all key stages) Guidance

- Sentences for key stage 1 writing attainment of the expected standard and greater depth have not been triggered because the criteria have not been met or the cohort is lower than 11 pupils.
- Early years foundation stage attainment of the expected standard in the writing early learning goal was not significantly different to national or not in the highest/lowest 20% of all schools in 2018.

Mathematics

Attainment (all key stages) Guidance

- A sentence for key stage 1 mathematics attainment of the expected standard has not been triggered because the criteria have not been met or the cohort is lower than 11 pupils. Key stage 1 attainment of greater depth in mathematics (34%) was significantly **above** national and in the **highest** 20% of all schools in 2019 as well as in 2018 and 2017.

- Early years foundation stage attainment of the expected standard in the mathematics early learning goal was not significantly different to national or not in the highest/lowest 20% of all schools in 2018.

Other measures in 2019 [Guidance](#)

- A sentence for the percentage achieving a good level of development in the early years foundation stage in 2018 has not been triggered because the criteria have not been met or the cohort is lower than 11 pupils.

Absence [Guidance](#)

- In 2017/18, the rate of overall absence (3.50%) was below the national average for schools with a similar level of deprivation (4.11%).
- A sentence for overall absence trend has not been triggered because the criteria have not been met or the cohort is lower than 11 pupils.

Exclusions [Guidance](#)

- A sentence for the rate of fixed period exclusions has not been triggered because the criteria have not been met or the cohort is lower than 11 pupils.
- A sentence for the rate of repeat period exclusions has not been triggered because the criteria have not been met or the cohort is lower than 11 pupils.
- Of the 2 pupils with at least one fixed period exclusion in 2017/18, 1 was excluded on more than one occasion but fewer than 10.
- Of the 5 fixed period exclusions in 2017/18, 3 were for **physical assault against an adult**. Other reasons which accounted for more than 10% of fixed period exclusions in 2017/18 were: verbal abuse/threatening behaviour against an adult (2).
- There were no permanent exclusions in 2017/18. The national average for this year was close to zero. There were no permanent exclusions in the previous two years either.

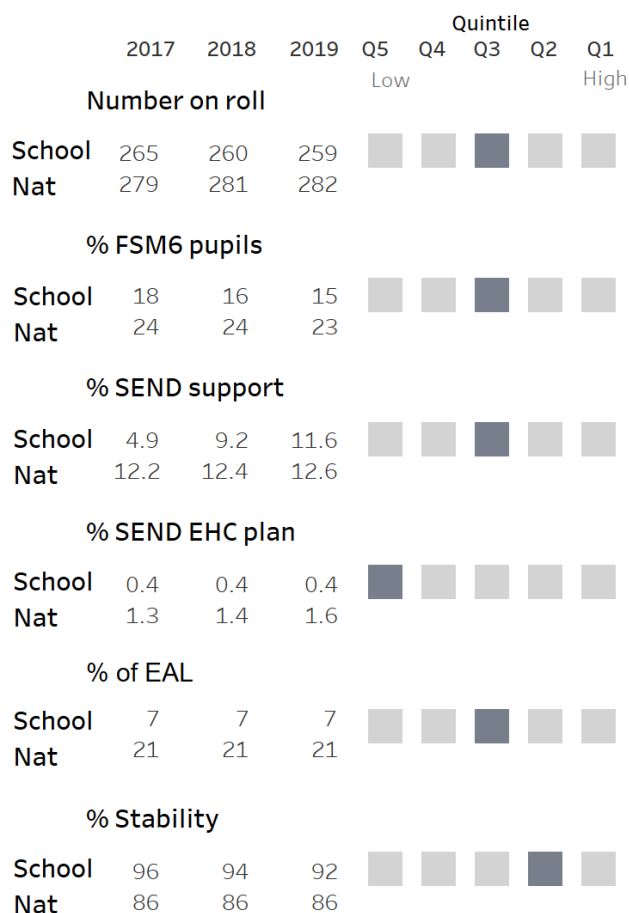
Pupil groups [Guidance](#)

As at October 2019:

- This school is maintained by Kent local authority which maintains 282 primary schools, 22 secondary schools, 23 special schools, 6 pupil referral units and 1 nursery school.
- The latest overall effectiveness grade for this school is outstanding (10/06/2011). The LA grade profile as at 1 October 2019 was:

School workforce Guidance

As at November 2018, there were:

- 53.3% of teachers with at least one period of sickness absence compared with a national average of 54%.
- 2.9 days on average lost to teacher sickness absence compared with a national average of 4.0.
- no full-time vacant teacher posts in the school.

Ethnicity Guidance

- This school has 13 out of 17 possible ethnic groups. Those with 5% or more are:
 - 80%: White - British
 - 6%: White - any other White background

Local area Guidance

- The school location deprivation indicator was in quintile 2 (less deprived) of all schools.

Finance Guidance

- In 2017/18, this school received £1,226,690 in grant funding, £24,064 less than the national average.
- In 2017/18, this school had a negative in-year balance (£-6,901), the second year in a row in which expenditure has exceeded income.
- In 2017/18, this school had a per pupil spend of £4,893.

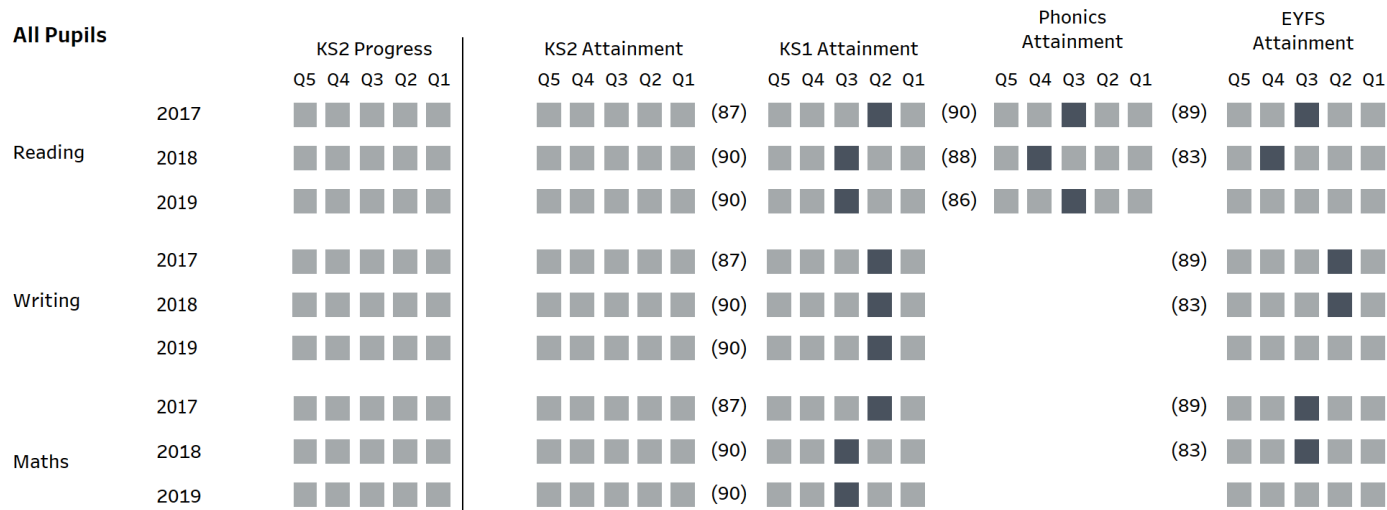
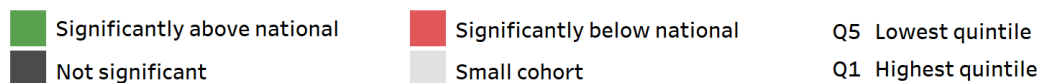
